Do you have your address number on your house or building?? Imagine how hard it is if you're an EMT, police officer or firefighter responding to a call for help and there are no numbers on the building. Street address numbers are needed in an emergency and it is also Iowa law and a Hull ordinance. Please make sure the numbers are visible from the street and are at least 4 inches in height. This will ensure that emergency responders can find your home quickly and easily. Install them for your safety. If you don't know your address number, contact the City Office, we will be glad to help.
